## Lesson Policies:

### HOW TO GET STARTED:

\*For your 1<sup>st</sup> lesson, you have 2 options:

1. **Orientation Package (\$220)** – Designed for the beginner rider. This lesson package consists of 4 – 1 hour lessons. During the 1 hour sessions, there are 30 minutes of Horse Management Instruction (learning how to groom and tack a horse safely, as well as learn parts of the tack, horse, etc...), and 30 minutes of Riding Instruction.
2. **Initial Evaluation Ride (\$55)** – This lesson is a 30 minute Private Lesson designed for the rider who has had at least 1 year of riding experience. This lesson is used to evaluate where the rider may fit into our weekly riding lessons.

\*After either the Orientation Package/Evaluation Ride, you will have the option to:

- a. **Join a Group Lesson (\$50)** – Highly recommended as most riders learn from each other. Plus, it's a great opportunity to meet new friends, and are more economical than private lessons (Your instructor will work with you to find a group lesson in which you will fit into best). Group lessons are 45 minutes long.
- b. **Stay in Private Lessons (\$55)** – Due to the lesson schedule being extremely full, we may not be able to accommodate a private lesson request. But, we will do our best. Private lessons are 30 minutes long.

## **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:**

---

**What will you need to bring to your 1<sup>st</sup> Lesson?**

### **FOR ANYONE VISITING THE BARN WITH THE RIDER:**

- **VERY IMPORTANT: ANYONE ENTERING THE BARN (PARENTS, GRANDPARENTS, ETC...) MUST WEAR PROPER FOOTWEAR. THIS IS A SAFETY RULE: NO OPEN TOED SHOES – NO SANDALS, CROCS, CLOGS...TENNIS SHOES ARE ACCEPTABLE AS WELL AS BOOTS. THANK YOU!**

### **FOR THE RIDER:**

- Long Pants – Breeches are preferred but not required.
- Hard Soled Shoes – Boots with no more than a 1 inch heel. Paddock boots are preferred, but not required. **YOU MAY NOT RIDE IN TENNIS SHOES!**
- During Winter Months, you may want to wear layers of clothing (Sweatshirts & Coats with zippers are a good idea, so you don't have to remove your helmet to get them off). Students start out cold, but then get warm while riding.
- Saddle Pad – Once you join a regular weekly lesson, we ask that riders bring their own saddle pad each week. We can help you order one, if needed. Riders are expected to bring with them each week, and are responsible for cleaning the pads regularly.

### **Do I need to bring my own helmet?**

\*No, we provide helmets. But, we recommend that you get your own helmet if you are serious about riding in the long term. Helmets must be ASTM/SEI Certified and worn at all times while mounted.

### **Can I watch my child ride during their lesson?**

Parents are welcome to watch the lesson. However, some kids do best with mom or dad hanging out around the corner out of sight (the distraction of a parent watching sometimes does not help with attention spans). Please note that ANYONE entering the barn (moms, dads, grandparents, siblings) needs to wear proper footwear. No sandals or crocs. Tennis shoes or boots are required. This is a safety rule.

Also, PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE do NOT coach your kid from the sideline. Your instructor is very knowledgeable and has the safety of your child as their first priority. Trying to listen to 2 people at once is difficult and can lead to frustration for both the rider & instructor. This can also become dangerous as it is distracting for the rider and they may not be able to hear important instructions to help keep them safe in the saddle. An encouraging word from time to time is welcome, but please let the instructor do their job.

## Where can I purchase a Helmet, Breeches and/or Paddock Boots?

\*There are a number of local tack stores which carry these products:

- *Tractor Supply Co.* – carries certified Troxel Brand helmets for around \$45. They also carry a handful of paddock boots online.
- *Grand Champion Tack (3905 W. 96<sup>th</sup> St, Indpls, IN – North Side)* – carries various brands of certified helmets, boots & breeches. (317) 872-4248

## CANCELATIONS:

### Extreme Temperatures:

\*Lessons will be cancelled if the day time temperature is either below 20 degrees or above 90 degrees. This is for both the rider's and horse's health.

### Lesson Cancellations:
